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IMPACT of COVID

Per the expectation of the MA Dept of Secondary Education, Q4 of 2020 was graded Pass (P)/ Fail (F). For GPA calculation, "P" required successful completion of 80% of assignments (equating a 100%); "F" equated a grade of 59%.

For the school year 2020-2021, students were able to attend class either hybrid or fully remote. Fully remote students were assigned to separate remote classes and, due to staffing, did not have the same access to a variety of courses at all levels (AP/honors/CP), including electives. As such, for the school year 2020-2021, all approved courses are included in the BHS GPA.
